We're looking to fund	<p>We are looking to fund programs, initiatives or events that benefit the Yarrabilba community through improving social, environmental and economic outcomes. More specifically, those which:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Promote community resilience</li><li>2. Promote environmental sustainability and more efficient use of local resources (eg re-use / recycle / repurpose).</li><li>3. Activate public recreational space</li><li>4. Support workforce participation</li></ol> <p>* Special consideration will be given to groups and organisations who haven't previously been funded</p> <p>* Projects will need to comply with the Australian Government's COVID-19 safety measures</p>
Amount	On this occasion, there will be a mix of standard grants for small scale initiatives (up to \$10k) and larger one-off grants (\$10k-\$50k) available for identified community priority areas.
Duration	On this occasion, applicants must complete and acquit their grant within 2 yrs
Eligibility	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Applicants must be a not-for-profit body with a current and valid ABN, such as an incorporated association, or be auspiced by one</li><li>• Applicants must be located within or offer a project within Yarrabilba</li><li>• A single application will only be considered per grant round</li><li>• Larger grants will require additional applicant details*</li></ul>
What will not be funded	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Projects which don't comply with the Australian Government's COVID-19 safety measures</li><li>• Organisational core operating costs such as funding for permanent staff members, insurance and utilities</li><li>• Commercial activities and organisations</li><li>• Projects that duplicate existing services and programs</li><li>• Projects with a sole religious or political purpose</li><li>• The advancement of sport is not considered as charitable activity by the ATO. Therefore, applications from sporting organisations need to clearly demonstrate a benefit to the wider community. Examples of charitable projects often championed by sporting groups include building and maintaining multi-purpose public facilities, all abilities programs, health promotion and leadership education</li></ul>

Criteria	Grants will be awarded on the recommendation of the Yarrabilba Community Grants Program Advisory Board and will be assessed on how well project outcomes align with Lendlease's social, economic and environmental priority areas. Applications that demonstrate collaboration with other Yarrabilba organisations, groups, schools, or clubs will be highly regarded
