

David Mott is a local photographer living in Jordan Springs. He shares some photography tips, tricks and why he loves living in our community.

#### What inspires your photography?

Professional photographers who specialise in landscape but also wildlife. Their work is amazing and the more I see, the more I want to do.

Looking at the sky or a landscape and imagining how I can frame it. Photography teaches you to "see" and once you start seeing everything in a frame the world looks different and you see photo opportunities everywhere.

#### Any advice to budding photographers?

- Go out and shoot everything. Join online photography groups or a club, enter competitions, hang out with other people who love photography.
- Do a workshop with a pro there's lots on offer. I completed an online photography course. It was great and I'm still in contact with other photographers who did the course.

- Learn to take criticism and share your work with other photographers. Share a shot that failed, ask for help and then re-shoot it.
- The best camera you'll ever own is the one in your hand right now. Doesn't matter if it's your phone or a big DSLR – just use it. I never leave the house without a camera.

## What do you like about living in Jordan Springs?

I love the lakes, the pathways and the easy access to the blue mountains and rural areas. I cycle every day and have a couple of motorbikes so living here is a dream for me where I can combine all my hobbies all at once.

I really like the convenience of having everything close by. I have the shops near me, but I live opposite lovely bushland so feel like I'm away from everything as well. My neighbours and the people in Jordan Springs are so friendly and wave and say hello when I'm cycling around. It's a lovely place to live.

#### South Creek Bridge

The construction of the new South Creek Bridge is underway. The bridge spans over 100m and is an integral part of developing the East West Connector Road.

The road will link Jordan Springs, Ropes Crossing and Dunheved and will greatly reduce travel times between the three suburbs.
