

Springfield Lakes Hike and Bike Trails

White Rock - Spring Mountain Conservation Estate

This area of natural bushland is one of the last remnants of what was once an extensive Eucalypt forest covering the entire greater Springfield area and beyond. This remnant is now preserved and managed under the Ipswich Enviroplan to provide habitat for wildlife, conserve biodiversity and provide natural places for low-impact recreation.

These recreational trails have been provided for your enjoyment, so please remember that this natural bushland is precious and needs to be cared for so that it can be enjoyed by future generations.
