UNDERSTANDING YOUR SURROUNDINGS

Alkimos Beach has been built around a bold vision: to create a sustainable coastal community of global significance. 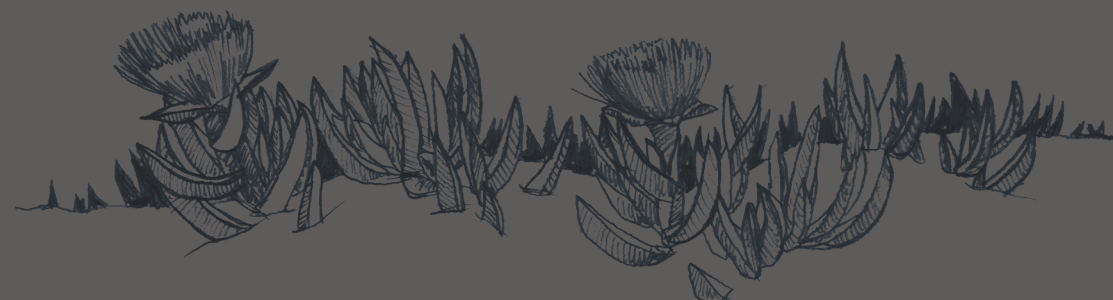
